# SFIC TAKES THE LEAD IN ENCOURAGING BETTER HEALTH AND WELLNESS STANDARDS IN THE NEWLY RENOVATED HOMES AND OFFICES

Ms Low Yen Ling, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Trade and Industry and Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth, officially launched the SFIC Sustainability Furniture Mark (SFM) on 30 October 2024 at the 2nd SFIC Sustainability Summit, recognising 28 furniture companies for products with certified safe formaldehyde emissions.

The SFM will establish benchmarks for Sustainability in the furniture industry. In the first year, SFM will focus on low formaldehyde emissions, a crucial aspect of healthy indoor air quality. The SFM will focus on other areas of sustainability in subsequent years.

Mr Phua Boon Huat, SFIC President, said: "With increased consumers' focus on sustainability, health and wellness in their choice of furniture and furnishing products, the SFM would provide them with a clear, industry-wide standard that can be easily recognised. This provides consumers with the confidence and assurance when making informed, responsible purchase decisions."

Commune Lifestyle is one such company that has been recognised. Mr Joshua Koh, CEO, Commune Lifestyle Pte Ltd, shared: "At Commune, we are deeply committed to sustainability, integrating practices such as sustainable packaging,

going nearly paperless in our operations, and using low formaldehyde materials. We believe the SFM will further boost consumer confidence by ensuring our products meet the health and safety standards, ultimately driving sales and trust in our brand."

Mr Nigel Yap, General Manager of Pepperwall Pte Ltd, shared that "Pepperwall views sustainability as a key consideration in our product development process. The SFM is a key part of SFIC's Furniture Sustainability Programme to drive industry-wide adoption of safer and more sustainability practices. There are 3 key areas that the programme focuses on - Setting the Benchmark for Sustainable Practices, Building Capability for a Sustainable Future, and Thought Leadership: Building a Sustainable Future, Together.

The SFM is an industry-initiated label to recognise SFIC members that have embarked on their sustainability journeys. In the first year, SFM will focus on recognising companies with certified low formaldehyde emitting products.

Subsequently, SFIC plans to layer on other areas of sustainability such as reporting, use of sustainable materials and recycling. We will continue to support companies in their sustainability journey with programmes and training.

The SFM will need to be renewed annually. To ensure that the SFM is kept valid and up-to-date, the evaluation criteria might be updated periodically. Companies would be required to produce valid supporting certifications that meet these updated criteria during their renewal.

#### • Sustainability Leaders Programme (SLP):

The Sustainability Leaders Programme has built foundational capabilities for nearly 100 furniture companies, covering essential topics like sustainability certifications, carbon management, health and well-being, advanced manufacturing, upcycling and recycling, and circular economy practices.

#### Transformational Mission Trips:

SFIC have successfully embarked on sustainability missions to Denmark in 2022, Tokyo in 2023 and Shenzhen/Hong Kong in 2024, enabling furniture companies to learn from leading international practices and adapt their business models to capture new opportunities presented by the sustainability agenda.

#### Learning Journeys:

# • SFIC Sustainability Summit:

SFIC launched its inaugural Sustainability Summit in 2023, attracting 133 participants from across ASEAN and Japan. The success of this event has paved the way for a second Summit in 2024.

The Summit seeks to explore the transformative potential of circular economy practices in urban cities, emphasising creativity, sustainability and the critical role that disciplines such as architecture and furniture manufacturing play in fostering healthy and safe spaces.

It is aimed to:

- (a) Showcase current trends with regards to health and safety in the furniture and furnishing space eg. emission control, innovative materials, focus on low VOC emission products and processes.
- (b) Provide a networking platform for cross industries collaboration in the sustainability space with a focus on health and safety.
- (c) Showcase proven use cases to inspire and motivate the audience to embark on their own journeys.

# • Sustainability Leaders Programme (Advanced):

SFIC commissioned a white paper that provides a comprehensive overview of formaldehyde, its effects on human health and the environment, and strategies for mitigating its use in the furniture and furnishings industry.

The report is divided into three main sections:

(a) **Overview of Formaldehyde:** This section examines the current global landscape of formaldehyde use, consumer awareness, and its environmental impact.
